## South Kent Circuit Mission Plan: June 2022

The calling of the South Kent Methodist Circuit is to respond to the gospel of God's love in Christ and to live out its discipleship in worship and mission.

We will use the circuit's resources to welcome everyone and to:

- Increase awareness of God's presence and celebrate God's love for all through prayer and worship for all ages; in our churches, on-line and in other places
- Help people to grow and learn as Christians through mutual support, care and by offering opportunities for discussion and reflection on matters of faith
- Be a good neighbour to people in need, showing compassion and empathy and challenging injustice. Caring for the environment in our local churches, communities and beyond.
- Proclaim the good news of Christ, guard against being apologetic about our faith and develop in confidence in sharing it with others.

In all these things we will seek to work in partnership with others wherever possible.

## **Circuit Mission Strategy 2022/2023**

Undergirding all things in prayer, to develop and fulfil our priorities as a circuit we will:

- Focus on the development of new ways of being church relevant for the times we are living in, through continued analysis of the circuit's resources of people, property and finance, and use them in ways that will further the work of God across the circuit. This will have a particular focus at Sandgate Road in Folkestone.
- Support each of the circuit churches to discern their mission and strategy for the future, encourage working together across the circuit.
- Create loving communities characterised by welcome, generosity, hospitality, kindness and respect. Embrace diversity and creativity.
- o Continue to encourage work with children and young people
- Give generously, with thought and prayer, of our time and money for the work of God in the church and the world
- o Ensure our safeguarding system, procedures and training are in good order
- Expand and explore our ecumenical work:
   within our LEPs at Hamstreet and the United Church in Ashford,
   working with the Church of England at St Michael's, Hythe and at the John Wesley
   School Ashford, and working with Churches Together and other community groups
   across the whole circuit.
- Develop pioneer ministry in new housing areas, particularly through the work of our New Housing Missioner in the Chilmington area of Ashford working alongside the Methodist South East District and with the United Reformed Church
- Encourage and develop our work with refugees and asylum seekers, particularly at Folkestone, Sandgate Road and Cade Road, UCA.
- o Work alongside and support the work of MHA at Grace Court, Folkestone and beyond
